### Code of Conduct for Young People

The governing bodies of Golf in Ireland and Corrstown Golf Club wish to provide the best possible environment for all young people involved in the sport. Young people deserve to be given enjoyable, safe sporting opportunities free of abuse of any kind. These participants have rights, which must be respected and responsibilities that they must accept. Young people should be encouraged to realise that they have responsibilities to treat other participants and sports leaders with fairness and respect.

### Young players are entitled to:

- Be safe and to feel safe
- Be listened to
- Be believed
- Have fun and enjoy golf
- Have a voice in relation to their activities within golf
- Be treated with dignity, sensitivity and respect (by everyone incl. club officials, adults and other juniors)
- Participate on an equitable and fair manner, irrespective of ability, disability, gender, religion, social class, etc.
- Experience competition at a level at which they feel comfortable
- Make complaints and have them dealt with
- Get help against bullies
- Say No
- Protect their own bodies
- Confidentiality

### **Young players should always:**

- Treat Sports Leaders with respect, (including professionals, coaches, convenors, club officials, etc.)
- Look out for themselves and the welfare of others especially younger and less experienced members
- Play fairly at all times
- Do their best at all times
- Be organised and on time, tell someone if they are leaving a venue or competition
- Respect team members, even when things go wrong
- Respect opponents, be gracious in defeat
- Abide by the rules of Corrstown Golf Club
- Dress in an appropriate manner when on the course and in the clubhouse
- Abide by the rules set down by team managers when travelling to away events, representing the club
- Behave in a manner that avoids bringing golf into disrepute
- Talk to a Junior Club official if they have any problems
- Talk to a Junior Club official if they believe another Junior member is being bullied or treated unfairly

### **Young players should never:**

- Cheat
- Use violence or engage in irresponsible, abusive, inappropriate or illegal behaviour
- Shout or argue with officials, team mates, opponents, fellow members
- Harm team members, opponents or their property
- Bully or use bullying tactics to isolate another player or gain advantage
- Take banned substances, drink alcohol, smoke or engage in sexual behaviour
- Keep secrets, especially if they have been caused harm
- Tell lies about adults / young people, Spread rumours
- Discriminate against other players on the basis of gender, age, disability, social class, religion, race, etc.

### **Guidelines for Parents**

Golf and its affiliated organisations believe that parents should:

- Be a role model for your child and maintain the highest standards of conduct when interacting with young people, other parents, officials and organisers.
- Always behave responsibly and do not seek to unfairly affect a player or the outcome of the game.
- Never intentionally expose any young participant to embarrassment or disparagement by the use of flippant or sarcastic remarks.
- Always recognise the value and importance of the officials and volunteers who provide sporting and recreational opportunities for your child.
- Do not publicly question the judgment or honesty of referees, coaches or organisers.
- Respect convenors, professionals, coaches, referees, organisers and other players.
- Parents are welcome to attend events and coaching sessions but should not interfere with the coach or professional while working with the player.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules. Teach your child that honest endeavour is as important as winning and do all you can to encourage good sportsmanship.

- Set a good example by applauding good play on both sides. Encourage mutual respect for teammates and opponents.
- Parents should support all efforts to remove abusive behaviour and bullying behaviour in all its forms. Please refer to bullying policy within these guidelines.

### **Parents Code of Conduct:**

- I will respect the rules and procedures set down by Corrstown Golf Club and the relevant Golfing Unions.
- I will respect my child's teammates and leaders as well as players, parents and coaches from opposing teams.
- I will encourage my child to treat other participants, professionals, coaches, convenors, selectors and managers with respect.
- I will give encouragement and applaud only positive accomplishments whether from my child, his/her teammates, their opponents or the officials.
- I will respect my child's leader(s) and support his/her efforts.
- I will respect the officials and their authority during sessions and events within the organisation and under the auspice of Golf.
- I will never demonstrate threatening or abusive behaviour or use foul language.

Corrstown Junior Club operates under the following premise and proposes to add the following statement into the constitution of Corrstown Golf Club at the next AGM.

*Golfing Union of Ireland (GUI), Irish Ladies Golfing Union (ILGU), Professional Golfers Association (PGA) are fully committed to safeguarding the well being of their members. Every individual in golf should at all times, show respect and understanding for members rights, safety and welfare and conduct themselves in a way that reflects the principles of the organisation and the guidelines contained in the Code of Ethics and Good Practice for Children's Sport.*

*In working with young people in golf our first priority is the welfare of the young people and we are committed to providing an environment that will allow participants to perform to the best of their ability, free from bullying and intimidation.*

We/I understand that Corrstown Golf Club (hereinafter called “the Club”) has no insurance cover in respect of any child on the golf course who is under the age of 12 years, unless s/he is accompanied by a person over the age of 18 years. We/I further acknowledge that we/I have been notified by the Club that no child under the age of 12 years may be present on the golf course or on the premises of the Club unless s/he is accompanied and directly supervised at all times by a person over the age of 18 years.

We/I hereby undertake that we/I take full and sole responsibility for ensuring that our/my child will not be present on the course or the premises of the Club unless accompanied and supervised at all times by a person who is over the age of 18 years and further that we/I will take full and sole responsibility for making the necessary arrangements for the attendance of a person over the age of 18 years to supervise and accompany our/my child at all times while our child is on the course or within the premises of the Club.

We/I acknowledge and accept that it is not the responsibility or function of the Club to police this policy or to monitor the absence of supervision or the presence of our/my child on the course or within the premises.

We/I accept that if our/my child is present on the course and not supervised that they will be liable to be removed from the course by any member.

We/I also accept that any breach of this regulation is to be treated as a serious matter and, in the event that our/my child is on the course and not supervised, our/my child may be suspended from playing golf in the Club.

We/I hereby undertake to indemnify the Club against any or all claims or costs that might arise in respect of any injury or loss howsoever arising that relates to or involves the presence of our/my child on the course while s/he is not supervised.
